Knighton BEC Rd 3

Rd 3 of the British Enduro championship headed to Mid Wales and the small town of Knighton just inside the Welsh border, we had good success here last year and we were optimistic about a strong team showing this time out as the organising club used the same special tests as last year with just some slight revisions. Championship riders would make 3 laps of the forest on Saturday which included a grassy MX style test and a modified cross-country test which now included some forestry going.

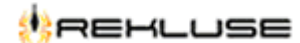
Greg Evans KTM 350 XCF; last year Greg put the pressure on David Knight here by winning many tests, this is one of Greg's favourite events and this year he was even quicker, on Saturday he was never challenged and won all the tests except for the final MX. His 350 XCF seemed to be the ideal machine to find grip on the slippery grass tests, he had a winning margin of 33 seconds yet the difference between 2nd to 10th position was only 40 seconds, so the racing for the final podium positions was very close and competitive. On day 2 when the tests were dryer and more defined his winning margin was less, but again he had a trouble free ride and won the majority of tests, this double win puts Greg in a commanding lead of the British Enduro championship.

Daryl Bolter KTM 250 XCF; another solid result from Daryl with a double E1 class win and 4th overall for the weekend, Daryl started Sunday with great speed and was even challenging Greg in the early stages for the lead after winning the opening MX tests, after two wins this weekend Daryl also leads the E1 4 stroke championship.

Jonny Walker KTM 300 EXC; Whiskey boy did not have the best of weekends despite being on form recently, his first two MX tests on Saturday were way off the pace, fortunately he pulled back some time by setting cross country times which were 2nd only to Greg, he finished the day in 9th. On Sunday he was back on the pace and finished in 6th overall and only 17 seconds away from the podium.

James Giddings KTM 125 EXC; James had his best result of the season, he won the E1 expert class both days and finished 4th overall.
